From the Minister's Desk 2

From the Minister's Desk,

You will find churches today decorated with iconography inspired by Biblical stories and motifs. The fish, a cluster of grapes, a rainbow, a dove, a lamb, the chi-rho, and the cross all find their way, for instance, from the Bible's stories onto paraments, and into illuminated manuscripts and stained glass windows. Another Biblical symbol found in churches today is a boat.

God protected Noah's family during the great flood (1 Peter 3:20-21). Jesus was in a boat with his disciples when he stilled the storm (Mark 4:35-41). The early church understood Noah's Ark as a prefiguring of the church so adopting the use of a symbol that evoked and combined elements of several Biblical stories made sense.

Two millennia ago, before diesel-powered cruise ships or nuclear-powered aircraft carriers, there were two options for locomotion on bodies of water. One option was muscle. A boat or ship was propelled by human beings rowing with oars. The other option was to harness wind power using a sail. A sailboat powered by the wind serves as a symbolic stand-in for the church because the Holy Spirit powers the church just as the wind fills the sail of a ship and moves it along.

The word for spirit in the New Testament is *pneuma*. In the Hebrew of the Old Testament the word is *ruach*. The meaning of both words includes breath or wind. It was on Pentecost in 30 AD, fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension, that the Holy Spirit empowered the waiting disciples for their vocation as witnesses to the gospel (Acts 2:1-4).

On the first Pentecost, the church that Jesus called into being and founded on faith in himself as messiah or Christ (Matthew 16:18) was empowered by the Holy Spirit to move beyond the confines of the upper room where a group of unsure disciples and friends of Jesus were gathered. The Holy Spirit breathed the breath of life into the body of Christ (Genesis 2:7, cf. 1 Corinthians 12:12). Enlivened and empowered by the Holy Spirit, that newly emboldened group of men and women set out into the world to turn it upside down. Nothing would be the same after Pentecost.

Acts 2 describes the Pentecost event as being accompanied by a sound like a tremendous rushing wind filling the room in which the disciples gathered. We are to imagine in that account of the first Pentecost the Holy Spirit like a gale filling the sails of the ship that is the church and launching it out to carry the gospel to the world.

The Book of Acts that begins with Pentecost relates the unfolding story of how the Holy Spirit enabled and empowered Christ's church to share the saving love of God. As Acts describes it, in the earliest days of its mission, the gospel was boldly shared with hostile audiences and accompanied by signs and wonders that served to authenticate the message of Jesus.

The Holy Spirit provided courage and empowered Christ's first disciples two thousand years ago. We are called to trust ourselves to the same Holy Spirit today for all we need and require to be effective disciples in the 21st Century. The Holy Spirit equips and gifts the members of Christ's church to accomplish their mission (1 Corinthians 12). The Spirit still fills the sails of the church and launches us out to fulfill God's plan and purpose. May we rediscover the truth of the Holy Spirit's empowerment of Christ's disciples this Pentecost.
